

At first glance it looks like this postal card was cancelled twice when mailed from Presque Isle, Maine. But the card was actually mailed twice. First on Aug 01, 1930 to Patten, ME showing an assessment due. The recipient paid the amount due and returned the card to the insurance company. The card then was re-mailed by adding a stamp to the card on Sep 02, 1930 to confirm payment.

A Night at D.A. Coffins?

I returned late last night from a visit to the Waterville, Maine stamp show. I had driven up the night before to preclude the need to get up at 4:00 in the morning. Upon arrival in Waterville, I found that there was nary a hotel room to be found as Colby College had several events going on and foliage viewers had flooded the area. Consequently at 8:00 I headed up interstate 95 in hopes of finding lodging and I was reminded of one of my favorite Maine covers.



This 1886 cover is franked with a #210 and mailed from Milton Plantation in Oxford County.



Milton Plantation lies with its northern line about one mile south of the Androscoggin, midway between the eastern and western limits of Oxford County. Rumford bounds it on the north, Franklin Plantation on the east, Woodstock on the south, and Bethel on the west. The dimensions are about five and a half miles east and west by two and two-third miles north and south. The surface is broken and mountainous in the north-eastern and south-western parts, but more level, with some intervals along the courses of the streams in other portions. The principal streams are Concord River, with Peterson Stream and its other branches. In the north-eastern part are Glines and Peaked mountains, with Mount Zircon at the extreme angle, and Mount Hemingway just across the northern border. In the south, west, Bryant Mountain is the chief eminence. On the western slope of Mount Zircon is the noted Mount Zircon Mineral Spring.

The centres of business are on Concord River, at the centre of the township where there are a saw-mill for long and short lumber, a shingle-mill, a boot and shoe shop and a schoolhouse; and on Peterson Stream, at the western side of the township, where there are a steam saw-mill, a carriage-shop, a post-office and hotel. There is also a tub and pail handle factory in the plantation. The Oxford Mining Company Is located here. The nearest railroad station is that of the Grand Trunk Railroad at Locke's Mills. The nearest railroad connection is at Bryant's Pond, by the stage-line from that place to Rumford.

This plantation was organized in 1842. The Free Baptists have an organization here, and stated meetings. There are two public schoolhouses; and the school property is valued at \$600. The valuation of estates in 1870 was \$41,272. In 1880 it was \$40,966. The population in 1870 was 258. In 1880 it was 270.

Milton Plantation had a Post Office from 12/2/1856 - 8/30/1902. With most Post Offices, the Postal records indicated how and from where Postal service was to become available, but not Milton Plantation - it was just closed.



Today, Milton is considered "unincorporated territory". Oxford County is located in north western Maine, and today it is home to skiing, camping and other tourist attractions. The remains of the paper making industry still exist and the most southerly towns in the county are quaint Maine villages. The northern part of the county is sparsely populated or uninhabited. In 1886, logging, agriculture, hunting & fishing, and textile production (mostly in the most southerly towns) were the means of livelihood.

As I headed north on the interstate, the rain pelted down and thoughts raced between my recollections of this cover and a Stephen King novel. Could I end up at a hotel like this? Could I be the subject of some melodrama novel like The Philatelist Langolier?

Through the rain I spied a sign indicating lodging at the next exit and I found a small family operated motel. While Wi-fi was not an option, the room was neat and tidy and my fears of D.A. Coffin's 3rd Class Hotel thankfully were unfounded.

At a stamp show I attended recently I found a collector searching covers that had his birthday in the cancellation. I did a quick search and came up with a couple of examples that had mine—November 24. I decided that the #10 must have been canceled in 1852 which would have been exactly 100 years before my birth. I found a large cent and a 3 cent piece from the same year that could have been used to purchase the stamp. The cover with the #68 was mailed on Nov 24, 1864 from Portland, ME to Cuba.

Sgt. Frank W. Pearce Co. A, 2nd. Maine Cav.

Frank W. Pearce was a Maine farmer working on his family's farm, was well educated and a musician in the town band. At the outbreak of the Civil War he and several of his friends volunteered to serve in the army and help form a regimental band. Pearce served for many months in that capacity and apparently the War Department decided to disband most all of the regimental bands. Pearce was discharged from service as a result of this.

After being home for several months he was drafted. He borrowed \$300 from a local merchant (Charles P. Tenney) and paid for a draft substitute (John Cameron). Later he changed his mind, volunteered and went into the 2nd Maine Calvary as a Sergeant and later advancing to Sergeant Major. He saw action in Louisiana and Florida.


The 2nd Maine Cavalry was organized in Augusta, Maine November 30, 1863 through January 2, 1864 and mustered in for three years' service under the command of Colonel Ephraim W. Woodman.

The regiment was attached to District of La Fourche, Department of the Gulf, to July 1864. Pensacola, Florida, District of West Florida, Department of the Gulf, to October 1864. 2nd Brigade, District of West Florida, Department of the Gulf, to February 1865. 2nd Brigade, Lucas' Cavalry Division, Steele's Command, Military Division of West Mississippi, to April 1865. District of Florida to December 1865. The 2nd Maine Cavalry mustered out of service December 6, 1865 and was discharged December 21, 1865 in Augusta.

At the end of the war Pearce was field commissioned to 1st Lieutenant. He left the service to return to the farm , opened a clothing store and became a Postmaster.




Augusta, Maine to Mrs. F.W. Pearce, Houlton, Maine

"To follow the Regiment" over the postmark


