
# Davis Township Postal History Franklin County, Maine

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
Briefly, there was one post office in Davis Township.

1. <u>Kennebago Lake</u> Post Office opened on 8 May 1879 and closed on 31 March 1954.

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This composite of topographic maps from the 1930s shows the setting of the Kennebago Lake Post Office in Davis Township. Note that there was another post office, called Grants, located at Grant's Camps at the other end of the lake, in the neighboring Stetsontown Township. That end of the lake was served by a branch of the Maine Central Railroad for some time. (See the <u>Maine</u> <u>Postal History page for Stetsontown Township</u> for more information.)

## Kennebago

Please note that there was also a post office called just *Kennebago*, at the northwestern end of the lake, in Stetsontown Township. That post office had the name of Kennebago only briefly, around 1913-1915. That post office was renamed Grants in 1915. # Kennebago Lake

8 May 1879: Kennebago Lake Post Office opened.

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8 May 1879:

Edward Grant became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

18 May 1892:

George A. Royal became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

5 June 1895:

Addie S. Richardson became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

#### 9 April 1908:

William E. Tibbetts became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.



6 September 1924: The circular postmark is 32 mm in diameter with a four-bar C/1 killer.

#### 2 September 1927:

Frank M. Toothaker became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

#### 21 April 1928:

Hayden B. Tibbetts became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

## 22 July 1935:

Ray L. Lisherness became the Acting Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

1 October 1935:

Ray L. Lisherness became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

6 June 1936:

J. Lewis York became the Acting Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

1 January 1937:

J. Lewis York became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

23 December 1942:

Gerald York became the Acting Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

1 July 1943:

J. Lewis York became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

7 June 1947: The double-ringed circular postmark is 29.5 mm in diameter with no killer.

### 26 May 1951:

Mrs. Ruth V. Russell became the Acting Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

#### 30 June 1952:

Mrs. Ruth V. Russell became the Postmaster of the Kennebago Lake Post Office.

#### 2 March 1954:

Kennebago Lake Post Office closed effective 31 March 1954 with service from Rangeley.
